



Hainan Surf Trip Packages

Surf in China? Yep.

China's Hainan island is very possibly the last easily-accessed tropical surf destination that remains virtually empty. In the fall and winter season, from November until February, Northeast swells bring consistent waves to the island's east coast. Hainan is only now starting to show up on the world surfing map. With a good variety of point and beach breaks and a small number of surfers, one can expect to get a lot of waves, and to have a great time experiencing the unique culture of China's southern-most province.



On the island for almost four years, no one knows the surf in Hainan better than Surfing Hainan. Our packages allow you to get the most out of your surf trip here, taking away all of the hassles of traveling in a foreign land.

Our multiple-day packages include airport transfer, beachfront accommodation at one of Hainan's best point breaks, guided transportation around to other great spots in the area , and three meals a day.

Surfers will stay in Riyuewan, which means Sun and Moon Bay in Chinese. One of the better known spots in Hainan, there are five or six different breaks in the two-kilometer stretch of beach around the hotel. Van transportation is also included, to drive to the breaks in the neighboring areas.

FAQ

What airport should I fly into?

Fly into either of Hainan's two airports, Haikou or Sanya. Haikou is on the north end; about a two hour drive south to RYW.

Sanya is in the south of the island, and is an hour and a half from RYW.

What are the conditions like?

In the peak surf season, November through February, Hainan's east coast generally gets a swell a week. The swells tend to peak for a day or two at head-high or better, with chest- to shoulder-high waves during the days before and after the peak of the swell. The better swells of the season can sometimes offer surf as big as double overhead.

Expect glassy conditions during the early morning and afternoon, and light to strong offshores during the day. In Hainan, colder temperatures can accompany good swell, so bring a full 3/2 wetsuits for the coldest days, as well as a top for warmer days.



What is the accommodation like?

Guests will stay at the three star 21st Century Hotel in Riyuewan, a short walk to the main peak in RYW. Prices are based on double occupancy. For those looking for luxurious accommodation, please inquire about staying at Le Meridien Resort and Spa.



What is there to do when not surfing?

When guests are surfed out, other activities are available, including riding our SUPs up the river, hiking on the gorgeous hillsides, fishing, or taking a trip into the inland town for massages or shopping.
